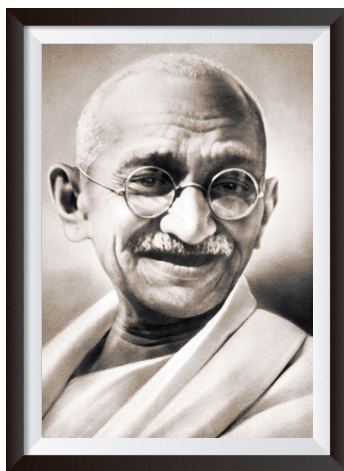

ADMISSION RELATED INFORMATION (2016-18)

Candidates must read the following admission related information before applying for admission to 2 year B.Ed. course for the session 2016 - 18 offered by Gandhi Centenary B.T. College, Habra and act accordingly.

- 1. Online Form till up date :** From 12th May 2015 to 3rd June, 2016
- 2. Online Application Fee :** Rs. 400.00 and Rs. 40.00 (Bank charges)
[to be deposited in the form of an online generated Challan in favour of Gandhi Centenary B. T. College, Habra at any Branch of United Bank of India]
- 3. Total Intake Capacity :** 50 (25 for deputed candidates, and 25 for Fresher candidates) Deputed candidates in different subjects will be selected on the basis of experience.
Fresher candidates in different subjects will be selected strictly on merit basis.
- 4. Eligibility criteria :**
Marks required : Applicants, both deputed and fresher, must have at least 50% marks in Bachelors' Degree and / or in the Masters' degree Examination in any recognized university. There shall be a relaxation of 5% Marks for SC / ST candidates.
Age limit : 35 years for fresher as on 01 .07 2015. There shall be a relaxation of age 5 years for SC/ST candidates.
Subject to opt. : Candidates must opt one school subject that they have studied either at Graduation or at Post Graduation level. from the following subjects.

- 5. Scoring System :** Refer to college Homepage in 'Admission Tab' and see Marks distribution for different qualifications for Admission to B. Ed course.
- 6. Admission Fees :** Rs. 45,000.00 per year for Fresher candidates and Rs. 47,400.00 per year for deputed candidates. [to be deposited in the name of Gandhi Centenary B.T. College. Habra at United Bank of India, Sree Chaitanya college branch]. Additionally, Rs. 6,000.00 per year for Hostel for Candidates applying For Hostel (Boys and Girls).

N.B. - In case of non-availability of deputed candidates, the seats will be converted for the Fresher Candidates as per the permission of de-reservation of the affiliating University.

8. Documents to be produced for verification by all candidates :

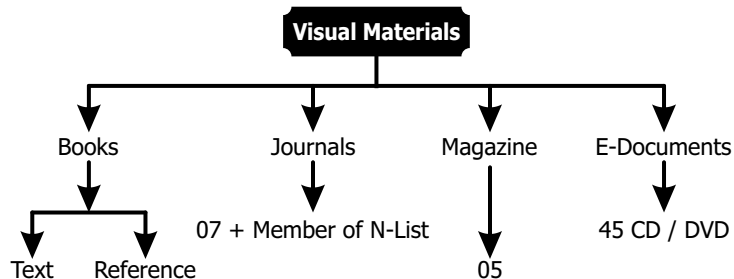

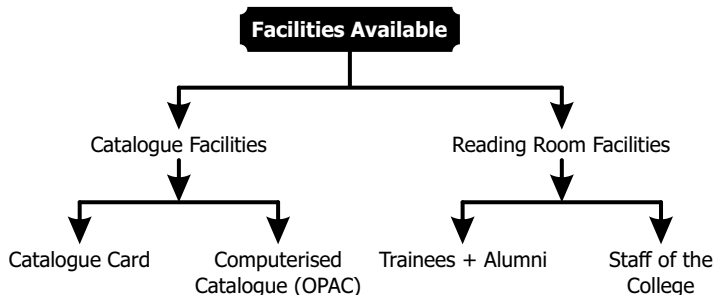
